Washers or Dryers	Freezers or Refrigerators

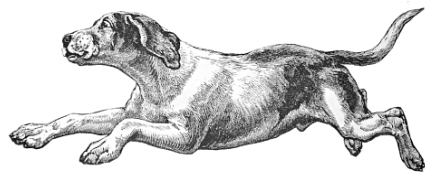
