On 8-20-2009, eight officers of the Shoreacres Police Department conducted a drug interdiction checkpoint in the 3400-3500 block of State Highway 146 between the hours of 4pm and 4am. The only vehicles stopped were the ones officers obtained probable cause on. Officers arrested three people on outstanding felony warrants out of Harris County. Only one arrest for drugs was made. Some of the people stopped informed officers they knew they were going to be stopped because they had received calls from friends. Officers wrote twenty one tickets for traffic violations. Officers will conduct drug interdiction stops in the future at different times and days of the week.

I have read many emails on the city web page regarding the newly opened fishing pier in Shoreacres. I would like to advise people that only members with keys can obtain entry onto the pier. The fishing pier is private property and anyone fishing are just out on the pier who is not a member or guest of a member can be filed on for trespassing. The parking lot is also private property and will be treated the same. Please leave the pier as you find it. Take your trash with you and throw your unused bait back into the water. Any member can call the police dispatch at 281-326-5900 at any time about any violations that might occur there.

I have also received several emails about the school zone on old highway 146 in the City of Shoreacres. The City of Shoreacres now does not have a school zone in the city. With the closing of Bay Shore Elementary the school zones are no longer in effect. Yes the signs are still up but the yellow lights are not flashing. Officers will at times park on old highway 146 and other streets to watch the school buses unloading for the safety of the children.
