### 1.0 CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL:

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Moses at 7:00 p.m.

### 2.0 PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

- 3.1 Mayor Moses proclaimed the week of May 10-17, 2015 as National Police Week in the City of Shoreacres.
- 3.2 Mayor Moses proclaimed the month of May, 2015 as Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month in the City of Shoreacres.

### 4.0 APPROVAL OF MINUTES

4.1 Regular Council Meeting April 27, 2015.

Neil Moyer moved to approve the April 27, 2015 Regular Council Meeting minutes; Seconded by Nancy Schnell. Motion carried unanimously.

### 5.0 COUNCIL REPORTS & REQUESTS

5.1 <u>Mayor Moses</u> – Report on meetings attended.

Mayor Moses held numerous meetings and tele-conferences with TxDOT working on a resolution to the sound wall concerns. He will have an onsite meeting with TxDOT representatives on Tuesday, May 12.

### 6.0 PUBLIC HEARINGS & PUBLIC COMMENTS

#### 6.1 Citizen Comments:

<u>Ronald Moore – 401 Oakdale:</u> Addressed his concern regarding ditch drainage along Westview.

<u>Margaret Moore – 401 Oakdale</u>: Inquired about property tax break for seniors and ditch mowing schedules. She also commended our police department for doing a great job of monitoring the city.

<u>Charlotte Wells – 3342 Miramar</u>: Requested for closer watch for speeders on Miramar.

<u>Alicia McCarty – 506 Baywood</u>: Commented that Public Works did not give advance notice when they came out to replace her water meter. She would like an explanation on the fluctuation of water usage on her account and waiting for a return call or email from the Mayor. Also, suggested that the city create an official City of Shoreacres Facebook page.

<u>Felicia Ramos – 3416 Sunrise</u>: Commented that she has been in contact with TxDOT and Harris County regarding the drainage issues in the Bayou Forest subdivision and is awaiting answers from these agencies. She also brought up problem of snakes from the overgrown lot next to her.

<u>Kim Sanford – 211 Shore Acres Blvd.</u>: Commented that she has a Facebook page. Also, there are several Facebook web pages that are owned by current and upcoming council members that are bashing the city, the mayor and Mr. Stall, which is causing chaos in the city. She also submitted an open record request on Ms. Schnell and the information that she received is very alarming and believes that it is sufficient evidence for the removal of Ms. Schnell from council.

<u>Darlene Bays – 616 Baywood</u>: Commented that she is the next door neighbor of Ms. Schnell and that Nancy is dedicated and she does not feel threaten by her. Ms. Bays is appalled by some of the comments about Nancy tonight.

<u>Dolly Arons – 1118 N. Country Club</u>: Commented that she's very disappointed that Item 8.2 was put on the agenda tonight by a council member - council did not act on the open record request, therefore, it is not council business. In addition, Ms. Arons read a report from the La Porte Police Department about Ms. Schnell. The information was released through an open record request. She also made other statements, which questioned the competency of Ms. Schnell as a council member.

<u>David Jennings - 1017 W. Forest</u>: Commented that he does run a few websites and he will criticize a council member when he disagrees with them politically. He does not approve of the bashing that's going on tonight and has never attacked anyone personally on his websites.

<u>Michael Schnell – 618 Baywood</u>: Commented that he is a resident of Shoreacres for fifty one years and he does not approve of the bashing that's going on tonight.

<u>Terri Jennings – 1017 W. Forest</u>: Commented that she's thankful that her husband was elected. During the campaigning period, many of Mr. Jennings political signs were stolen, and that they had to use an attorney to be able to put campaign signs up.

### 7.0 ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

- 7.1 <u>City Administrator Report</u>: Mr. Stall reported on that Republic Waste will return on Thursday for heavy pick-up. Received a certified estimate from the Harris County Appraisal office indicating that the city's taxable property value is at \$115,249,538, the highest in the city's history.
- 7.2 <u>Monthly Police Department Report:</u> Chief Harrison reported all officers are current on First Aid and AED training. We've added two Master Peace Officers and an Advance Instructor. Thanked Mayor Moses for the recognition of National Police Week. He also Thank council members, Mr. Stall, and the citizens for their continued support.
- 7.3 Monthly Public Works Department Report: Mr. Stall reported: Public Works crews repaired seven water leaks and seven main line breaks. Our crews will continue with painting fire hydrants as weather permits. Mr. Arriaga has been trained to operate the slope mower and we will maintain our ditch mowing schedules as weather permits.

The following documents are enclosed for your review and consideration in the above-referenced matter:

- (1) The City of Shoreacres's (hereinafter referred to as "City") response to said Request, objecting to all information and identifying the basis for which the City deems the data to be exempt.
- (2) City's documents responsive to the request (Exhibit B, C, D, E and F).
- (3) Copy of Kimberly Sanford's open records request received by the City on April 23, 2015 (Exhibit A).

### REQUEST

The City respectfully requests an open records determination as to whether the documents must be produced and\or furnished.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND EXEMPTIONS

The identity of the requestor and the documents requested shall be identified below. The below-described objections give rise to the City's belief that the documents in its possession are exempt from public disclosure.

### OPEN RECORDS REQUEST

1) Kimberly Sanford's request is dated April 23, 2015; the request was received by the City on April 23, 2015.

Ms. Sanford requests that the City produce "all reports (Police, City) pertaining to 618 Baywood Street, LaPorte, Texas 77571 or Nancy and Michael Schnell within the past seven (7) years."

### **CITY'S OBJECTION**

The City objects to the disclosure of the following information:

As to Exhibit B (October 2, 2014 report), the City objects to the entire report:

Pursuant to Section 552.108 of the Texas Government Code, the City believes that Exhibit B is exempt from public disclosure.

Section 552.108 states the following:

- (a) Information held by a law enforcement agency or prosecutor that deals with the detention, investigation, or prosecution of crime is excepted from the requirement of Section 552.021 if:
  - (2) it is information that deals with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime only in relation to an investigation that did not result in conviction or deferred adjudication.
- (b) An internal record or notation of a law enforcement agency or prosecutor that is maintained for internal use in matters relating to law enforcement or prosecuting is excepted from the requirements of Section 552.021 if:
  - (2) the internal record or notation relates to law enforcement only in relation to an investigation that did not result in conviction or deferred adjudication.

Exhibit B is confidential and exempt from disclosure pursuant to Section 552.108 of the Texas Government Code because the information requested is being held by the Shoreacres Police Department's law enforcement agency and deals with an investigation. Exhibit B relates to a prior offense report. The investigation did not result in a conviction or deferred adjudication for Nancy Schnell. Rather, the investigation did not result in any criminal action. Accordingly, the City believes that Exhibit B is exempt from public disclosure.

Similarly, Exhibit B is confidential and exempt from disclosure pursuant to Section 552.108 of the Texas Government Code because the information requested is part of an internal record or

notation held by the Shoreacres Police Department's law enforcement agency and deals with an investigation. Exhibit B relates to a prior offense report. The investigation did not result in a conviction or deferred adjudication for Nancy Schnell. Rather, the investigation did not result in any criminal action. Accordingly, the City believes Exhibit B is exempt from public disclosure.

Alternatively, the City objects to the disclosure of Exhibit B based on Section 552.101 of the Government Code which excepts from public disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision."

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from required public disclosure information held confidential under case law. The section applies to information when its disclosure would constitute the common law tort of invasion of privacy through the disclosure of private facts. The information must 1) contain highly intimate or embarrassing facts about a person's private affairs such that its release would be highly objectionable to a reasonable person and 2) be of no legitimate concern to the public. See *Industrial Foundation of the South v. Texas Industrial Accident Board* 540 S.W. 2d. 668 (Tex. 1976).

In this case, Exhibit B involves an incident that took place in the backyard of Nancy Schnell's own home. The report does contain highly intimate or embarrassing facts about a person's private affairs such that its release would be highly objectionable to a reasonable person. The City claims that Nancy Schnell has an expectation of privacy of those private events that occur in her own backyard. Further, the City claims that the report is of no legitimate concern to the public because it occurred in Nancy Schnell's backyard, the contents of the offense report did not result in any criminal charge and the offense report contains private facts, to which Nancy Schnell maintains an expectation of privacy.

Third, the City objects to the release of Exhibit B under HIPPA laws. The result of the offense report was no criminal action against Nancy Schnell, but rather a temporary mental health commitment. This offense report, being tied to the temporary mental health commitment, is part of Nancy Schell's medical records that she has an expectation of privacy under the Medical Practice Act and HIPPA laws.

Finally, the City objects to the release of the listed cellular phone numbers, driver's license numbers and serial numbers in Exhibit B under sections 552.101 and 552.129 of the Government Code.

As to Exhibit C (May 18, 2012 report), the City objects to the release of the listed phone numbers, driver's license numbers and license plate numbers under sections 552.101 and 552.129 of the Government Code.

As to Exhibit D (August 1, 2012 report), the City objects to the release of the listed phone numbers, and driver's license numbers under sections 552.101 and 552.129 of the Government Code.

As to Exhibit E (October 18, 2008), the City objects to the release of the listed social security numbers, phone numbers, driver's license numbers and serial numbers under sections 552.101

and 552.129 of the Government Code.

As to Exhibit F (July 18, 2012), the City objects to the release of the entire report.

Pursuant to Section 552.108 of the Texas Government Code, the City believes that Exhibit F is exempt from public disclosure.

Section 552.108 states the following:

- (a) Information held by a law enforcement agency or prosecutor that deals with the detention, investigation, or prosecution of crime is excepted from the requirement of Section 552.021 if:
  - (2) it is information that deals with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime only in relation to an investigation that did not result in conviction or deferred adjudication.
- (b) An internal record or notation of a law enforcement agency or prosecutor that is maintained for internal use in matters relating to law enforcement or prosecuting is excepted from the requirements of Section 552.021 if:
  - (2) the internal record or notation relates to law enforcement only in relation to an investigation that did not result in conviction or deferred adjudication.

Exhibit F is confidential and exempt from disclosure pursuant to Section 552.108 of the Texas Government Code because the information requested is being held by the Shoreacres Police Department's law enforcement agency and deals with an investigation. 

\* \* \* \* \*

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHOREACRES:

That, the facts and matters set forth in the preamble of this Ordinance are hereby found to be true and correct; and,

That section 2-82 of the Shoreacres City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

### Sec. 2-82. – Norms of operation.

- (a) Operation of city council meetings.
  - (1) Any item in need of being placed on the agenda shall be submitted to the city secretary pursuant to agenda deadlines.
  - (2) The mayor or mayor pro tem will conduct an orderly meeting.
  - (3) Comments by the public will be limited to five minutes. The city secretary will monitor the time for each speaker with a timer that will sound after five minutes.
  - (4) Any changes to, or proposed city ordinances shall be scheduled on an agenda.
  - (5) Closed sessions of the city council meeting will be included in the business portion of the council meeting. After such closed session, council will reconvene to that scheduled meeting and take action on the closed portion of the meeting.
  - (6) Members of council shall not enter into a debate with a member of the public or staff at council meetings.
  - (7) Any concerns by a member of council over the behavior or work of a city employee during a council meeting should be directed to the mayor in private or closed session to ensure the concern is resolved.
  - (8) City council agenda items that are continued from one meeting to another shall have preference on the agenda under the same agenda category.
  - (9) It is not necessary for all council members to speak or give their viewpoints on every issue. On critical or significant issues, however, council members are encouraged to make a statement about their vote if they vote outside the majority.

(10) Any correspondence or other materials received at a council meeting shall be submitted to the city secretary and be documented with a receipt date and time.

- [(11) Members of council shall not use a wireless communication device to send electronic messages during a council meeting.]
- [(12)] (11) The mayor shall state each proposed motion in its final form for the city council, prior to council taking action on the agenda item.
- (b) Mayor and city council relations with city staff.
  - (1) The city staff, the mayor and council members shall show mutual respect to one another.
  - (2) City staff shall acknowledge the mayor and council as the policy makers and the mayor and city council shall acknowledge staff as the administrator of the council's policies.
  - (3) All requests for information or questions by the city council to staff shall be directed to the city administrator or department supervisors. All complaints should be submitted to the city administrator or mayor.
  - (4) All written informational material requested by individual council members shall be distributed by staff to all council members with the notation indicating which council member requested the information.
  - (5) The mayor and council shall not individually attempt to coerce or influence staff in the making of appointments, the awarding of contracts, the selection of consultants, the processing of development applications, or the granting of city licenses or permits.
  - (6) A council member shall not attempt to change or interfere with the operating policies and practices of any city department.
  - (7) Mail that is addressed to the mayor or city council shall be circulated by the city secretary to the mayor and city council. The mayor's response to mail received shall be distributed to city council for their information and council members shall distribute their responses of a mailed item to the mayor for his/her information.
  - (8) The city secretary shall not open mail addressed to an individual council member or mayor unless authorized to do so.
- (c) City council relationship with city commissions and committees.
  - (1) Members of council should not attempt to influence or publicly criticize city commissions or committee recommendations or to influence or lobby individual city commission or committee members on any item under consideration.
  - (2) Individual council members shall have the right to attend meetings but shall not speak or become involved in the meeting's discussion, except on matters affecting a council member as a private citizen or property owner.

- (d) Council member representation to other agencies and groups.
  - (1) If a member of city council appears before another governmental agency or organization to give a statement on an issue affecting the city, the council member should first indicate the majority position or opinion of the council, if one exists.
  - (2) Personal opinions and comments may be expressed if the council member clarifies that these statements do not represent the position of the city council.
- (e) City council handling of litigation and other confidential information.
  - (1) The mayor or city council shall keep all written materials and verbal information provided to them on matters that are confidential under state law in complete confidence to insure the city's position is not compromised. No disclosure or mention of information in these materials shall be made to anyone other than the mayor, council members, the city attorney, city administrator, or city secretary.
  - (2) If a city council in closed session has provided direction to city staff on proposed terms and conditions for any type of negotiations whether it be related to property acquisition or disposal, a proposed or pending claim or litigation, and/or employee negotiations, all contact with the other party and/or attorney shall be limited to, and made by, the designated city staff representative handling the negotiations, claim or litigation. Except as provided in subsection (3) below, no council member shall have any contact or discussion with the other party or its representative involved with the negotiation, claim or litigation at this time, nor shall any council member communicate or disclose any discussion conducted or information received in closed sessions. All public statements, information, and press releases shall be handled exclusively by the designated staff spokesperson.
  - (3) Notwithstanding the prohibition set forth in subsection (2) above, an individual council member, prior to attending a closed session or receiving confidential information concerning litigation or a claim, may have contact and/or discussion with a party or the party's representative with the respect to a claim for damages or litigation against the city, provided that the council member first satisfies each of the following requirements:
    - a. The council member must not have attended a closed session or received any confidential information concerning the party's claim or litigation;
    - b. Prior to initiating or allowing such contact, the council member shall provide the party and/or attorney, the mayor, the city clerk and the city attorney with a written declaration and agreement, signed under penalty of perjury, and in the format acceptable to the city attorney, that the council member: (a) fully excuses him/herself from, and waives all right to (i) any and all future participation in any decision which in any manner involves the party's/representative's claim and/or litigation, and (ii) that council members

right to receive confidential information and to attend closed sessions of the council; (b) does not and shall not purport to make such contact or any representation on behalf, or in his/her capacity as a member, of the council; and (c) has not received or been privy to, and shall not in any manner disclose any confidential information concerning the party's/representative's claim and/or litigation.

(4) The exception set forth in subsection (3) above shall be limited and strictly construed, shall not be construed as authorizing any contact not expressly authorized by its express language, and shall not under any circumstances be construed as authorizing any disclosure of any confidential information.

\* \* \* \*

That if any section, clause, sentence, or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance; and,

That the City Council officially finds, determines, recites, and declares that a sufficient written notice of the date, hour, place and subject of this meeting of the City Council was posted at a place convenient to the public at the City Hall of the City for the time required by law preceding this meeting, as required by the Open Meetings Law, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code; and that this meeting has been open to the public as required by law at all times during which this ordinance and the subject matter thereof has been discussed, considered and formally acted upon. The City Council further ratifies, approves and confirms such written notice and the contents and posting thereof.
