2.0 CITIZEN'S PRESENTATION

2.1 Citizen's Comments

Anita Willis, 1009 West Forest

- Reported having problems with her recycling. BFI broke the container while throwing it into the ditch, instead of placing it next to her driveway.
- Suggested that we establish some type of recycling drop-off center here in Shoreacres.

Mayor Edmonson said that the drop-off recycling of paper still exists, but the bin is now located next to Bayshore Elementary.

Asked if Forest Ave. was going to be repaved, since someone was marking off the side of the road.

Mayor Edmonson said that Ms. Willis' part of Forest was not on the schedule for repaying, but that she would try and found out whowas out there staking things out.

Asked if the culverts could be cleaned out; the mosquitoes are so bad because of the standing water.

Asked about the testing of fire hydrants a couple of meetings ago and where we stood on that.

Mayor Edmonson advised that we checked into itt and that the La Porte Volunteer Fire Department Personnel come out and test out hydrants annually during one of their training exercises, but if you haven't seen them or don't think that they have been out, please let her know. Reported that Public Works flushes them periodically also.

Greg Bess, 3316 Sunrise

Asked if we had looked at additional street lighting, there is a need in the major thoroughfares.

Volunteered his driveway to the Police Department to stake out speeders.

Mayor Edmonson said that she would check into it.

Dianne Victor, 3342 Miramar

Asked for the Police Department to patrol her street because the school bus driver speeds down her street in the mornings.

Mayor Edmonson said she has contacted the School District and will get the Chief of Police to contact them again.

Mark Jones, 630 Oakdale

Said that whatever the City was doing to keep the graffiti away from Circle Park is working. The new tables are still clean.

Reported that when the ditches on his street were cleaned out, they left all the "stuff" in the culverts, which still blocks the drainage. At one time, the City used a slope mower to mow the ditch but the last few times they have driven a tractor and it has caused deep ruts in the ditches, which now holds standing water.

Mary Beth Maher, 3610 Miramar

- Asked if City Hall recycled.

Mayor Edmonson said that the City will put a bin out and begin recycling at City Hall.

Tom Coleman, 207 Shoreacres Blvd.

3.0 ANNOUNCEMENTS AND REPORTS

3.1 Council Reports/ General Discussion

Alderman Washington

Had a neighbor ask about an update on the Oakdale repaving from Sunrise to Miramar.

Mayor Edmonson said this area is part of the contract that just started, and all four of the streets along that are in this project will be done within the next three to four months.

The City will then repave East and West Bayou north of Shoreacres Blvd.

He's going to start speaking to the Public Works Director, Eloy, about getting the old backhoe ready to sell; he has a potential buyer and said we should be able to close to \$5,000.00 or more.

Alderman Gomer

Reported a pile of dirt in the ditch on Baywood where Public Works had done some work.

At the end of Miramar at Shell Beach, the area should be a no parking zoneto prevent cars from blocking the fire hydrant

Mayor Edmonson said that there is a yellow painted line that designates this.

Alderman Ellis

Said that when they were redoing the ditches on Westview they left rutts all up and down the street, and asked whether or not this was going to be fixed.

Mayor Edmonson replied that we had rented an asphalt roller, but have since returned it, due to the cost. Now, when Public Works does any hot patching, they rent a roller for they day. She said that she doesn't really want to fix too much of that portion of Westview until after the work is done on Baywood and Shadylawn because it will probably get worse. She said that Westview was paved inexpensively as a street overlay, and she has already asked the County to repave that area as a part of the next paving joint venture.

Alderman Blanchard

Asked how a citizen could get a brief list of ordinances.

Mayor Edmonson said that basic questions can be answered by Robin or Latane Lamb, the Building Official or if they have several questions, they can come by city hall and pay \$5.00 for a Building Permit Packet. They may also go to our website and view the ordinances on line.

Mayor Edmonson

Said that Mr. Tom Coleman has been the city's representative for SEACAP for the last several years. Typically those meetings are not public meetings, but this next Wednesday night there will be an open meeting at 7:00 p.m. in Seabrook at the Ed White Youth Center; the topic will be port security.

Reported that the next Harris County Mayors and Council meeting will be at

the Houston Yacht Club, next Thursday night. The City of Morgan's

Point will be hosting the meeting. Mayor Edmonson, Alderman Ellis, and Joe Gomer so far plan to attend, and asked that any others planning to go too R.S.V.P. to Robin.

She and Alderman Washington have begun interviewing for the position of the City Administrator. They have received over twenty applicantions and have narrowed it down to around seven applicants. Reported on the sewer line that collapsed a few days before Christmas in the easement between Sunrise and Westview. They used a temporary pump-around for awhile, and then it just started flowing again. Public Works has obtained a bid for the repair, but it is quite high. It had appeared that cement was poured around a couple of the taps that were made
